Options' Dedicates the Thomas P. Gorham Center

In June 2nd, the beautifully restored former Casa Vincentia Convent will be dedicated as the Thomas P. Gorham Center in honor of Thomas Gorham, Options' retired Executive Director and founder of Options' in-prison programs. In 2019 Options purchased the former Casa Vincentia Convent at 3210 62nd Avenue in Oakland and undertook extensive retrofitting and remodeling. With the advent of the COVID pandemic in early 2020, the facility's individualized bedrooms and controlled bathing and eating areas were pressed into service for Options clients that had been exposed to the disease, or who had symptoms related to the disease. The facility became a safe haven to those clients quarantined due to COVID. As the



pandemic continued into the summer, Options partnered with Alameda County Behavioral Health and Horizon Services to make the facility available to clients of the Cronin House residential care program. As the pandemic subsided, that use was no longer required, and the facility was upgraded with a sprinkler system and other safety features. Options is now developing a program to provide safe and sober reentry services for up to twenty-five former inmates at the facility.

Executive Director Announces Key Leadership Team Promotions

A year-and-a-half into his Executive Directorship at Options, Justin Phillips is announcing Key Leadership Promotions to support Options' continued growth. As Options expands with new programs in Berkeley, Concord, and Richmond, and in prisons throughout the state, long-time staff members Suzoni Camp and Mike Thomas will be promoted on June 1st to key senior leadership positions.

As Chief of Operations, Suzoni Camp will oversee treatment programs, administration, human resources, and medical support. As Senior Director of Programs, Mike Thomas will oversee community outreach programs, housing, and special projects.

Executive Director Justin Phillips will continue to be directly involved with criminal justice programs and fund development, and directly supervise senior staff.

Berkeley Community Response Team

The City of Berkeley and Options Recovery Services have recently collaborated to implement a program of Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Navigators handpicked for their ability to serve diverse at-risk populations while showing compassion and empathy, which is due to their lived experience as well as their clinical expertise.

The team is highly skilled in outreach and engagement, crisis response and intervention and referral within multiple networks, and each team member was selected based on their unique skillsets.

The team is dispatched to targeted areas of concern that are identified by the city as well as partnering agencies, and consist of medical, clinical, and licensed clinicians to assure the best possible treatment referrals and service for those in crisis.

During each encounter the individual is offered the direct line to contact the team for a quick response or in the event of any urgent needs. Follow-ups are also done on a weekly basis.

Beginning in January, 2022, the team has engaged with more than 130 homeless individuals, providing referrals, warm handoffs, and transportation when needed. Referrals are made to Options' own services and to services provided by partner agencies.
